SHS programs are highly selective, with an approximate 25% acceptance rate. We excel in training students through teaching strategies such as problem-based learning, fostering critical thinking skills, and encouraging students to serve local, national, and international communities through service-oriented programs for medically-underserved populations. Our graduates are highly skilled, ethically and culturally aware, and highly sought after.

FACULTY HIGHLIGHTS

Dr. Arlette Ngoubene-Atioky is an assistant professor in the counseling psychology program, and her areas of academic interest include the social determinants of immigrants and refugee health and cross-cultural psychology.

Dr. Ingrid Provident is an associate professor and program coordinator of the online post professional OTD program. She has served on the accreditation team for the OT program at the Polytechnic University in Hong Kong and has contributed to and presented at several international conferences, including Tanzania, Kenya, South Africa and New Zealand. She was recently honored by AOTA as a fellow for excellence in teaching and service to the profession.

Dr. Debra Wolf is a professor within the healthcare informatics program and is a known international speaker, having presented at health conferences from Finland to France to China. Dr. Wolf was selected as a Nursing Ambassador to China, where she has collaborated with multiple healthcare organizations related to quality improvement. Dr. Wolf is a site evaluator for the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE), which accredits nursing programs throughout the U.S.

CHATHAM EASTSIDE

The School of Health Sciences is located at Chatham Eastside, part of the Shadyside Campus. Chatham Eastside is in Pittsburgh’s bustling East End district, near Bakery Square, a vibrant retail district that is home to Google’s Pittsburgh office. INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATION
