▶ WHY MADRID?

▶ STUDY AT UNIVERSIDAD NEBRIJA

Universidad Antonio de Nebrija is a private and independent university officially accredited by the Spanish Ministry of Education. The Centro de Estudios Hispánicos was created in 1985 exclusively for the teaching of Spanish and is close to museums, parks and transportation. Students enjoy an international environment inside a Spanish university.

► ACADEMICS

In the fall and spring terms, students can take a combination of Spanish and English taught courses for a maximum of 15 credits. Nebrija offers Spanish language instruction at all levels. Upon arrival, students take a placement test to determine their Spanish level. Students with A1 to B2 levels are placed in language and grammar courses as well as culture and conversation and reading and writing courses. Students in levels B2, C1 and C2 (high intermediate, advanced, and heritage speakers), can enroll in courses of their choice according to their level. These courses include language, conversation, writing, culture, literature, cinema, society, art, history, and Spanish for specific purposes.

English-taught coursework includes international business, marketing, communication, and management; cinema, art and architecture; culture and history; international relations; European studies; and gender studies. Nebrija's highly qualified and experienced professors use interactive, communicative and personalized teaching methods. All the programs include cultural and extracurricular activities.

During the summer program, students take two courses during each four-week term.

Credit-bearing Internships in combination with academic study are available for an additional fee (B1 Intermediate Spanish proficiency required).

► STUDENT SERVICES & ACTIVITIES

Nebrija's programs include, without any additional costs to students, activities in which professors guide their students to monuments, interesting sites and iconic neighborhoods in Madrid. These can include guided walks through Madrid neighborhoods and visits to museums. A wide variety of shows, plays, and workshops are offered to students throughout the year, including dance and games, cooking and intercultural events. Additional excursions outside of Madrid are offered for a fee during weekends to places such as Toledo, Segovia, Salamanca, and El Escorial. Other longer excursions may include Andalucía, Barcelona, or Salamanca. The price for these excursions includes round trip transportation, accommodation, entrance to monuments and a guide.

► ACCOMMODATIONS

Students can live with Spanish families in a homestay or in a student residence. Homestay students can choose between half and full board when they finalize their registration. Half board includes breakfast and lunch or dinner. Full board includes breakfast, lunch, and dinner. For more information about homestay, please write to hispanicos@nebrija.es.
