... WHY CYPRUS?

Cyprus, the third largest island in the Mediterranean, has a high standard of modern living and over 300 days of sunshine each year as well as 20% of the world's top beaches. The vibrant capital city, Nicosia, has a rich history with a medieval walled city, created by Venetians, juxtaposed with official public buildings and more modern parts of the city. The northern region of the island, and Nicosia, are occupied by Turkey, making the city the only capital in the world under two different governments. Temples, monasteries and museums commemorating Nicosia's rich, ancient history are open to the public. A center of international business, Nicosia hosts the headquarters for many Cypriot and international companies.

··· STUDY AT UNIVERSITY OF NICOSIA

The University of Nicosia (UNIC) is the largest in Cyprus with more than 13,000 students from 70 countries across the globe. UNIC is the largest university in Southern Europe that teaches primarily in English. Many of the degree programs and departments were the first of their kind in Cyprus. UNIC is one of the world's leaders in blockchain and cryptocurrency education and has leading programs in medicine, international relations, international accounting, architecture, and law. ... ACADEMICS

Semester programs include access to hundreds of courses across nearly every major. There are vast options for experience-based learning and research opportunities, along with full immersion in the classroom. Courses are offered in the following departments: accounting, architecture, art & design, banking & finance, business, communications, computer science, dance, hospitality & tourism, humanities, international relations, language & literature, life & health sciences, management, marketing, music, psychology, sciences & engineering, social sciences, and sports science.

Summer programs have specific academic tracks ranging from STEM to Liberal Arts and provide an intensive, specialized experience. Each track includes two courses, site and field visits, and an option to add the Mediterranean international travel package which visits Athens, Rome, and several Greek islands.

Semester students can participate in Internships for transferable credit in business, tourism, marketing, and communications. Customized internships are also available for students who qualify. Research opportunities are offered during the summer and semester programs. Students can propose a research project for approval or apply to join faculty research in progress. ... STUDENT SERVICES & ACTIVITIES

In addition to excursions and activities for study abroad students planned by the Global Semesters Office, UNIC's Events and Activities Office organizes a variety of student events and activities. These include awards ceremonies, charity events, Christmas dinners, dance classes, graduation dinners, international festivals, music festivals, seminars, talent shows, and documentary screenings. The multicultural environment at UNIC supports many ethnic societies that bring students of different backgrounds together to share their culture, traditions, history, music and food. UNIC has a Multifaith Prayer Room which promotes equality and tolerance and embraces the religious and spiritual diversity of students. Volunteer opportunities are available through the university or local organizations, such as Nicosia God Shelter, UNIC MediaZone, and United Nations' Hope for Children.

••• ACCOMMODATIONS

All students are housed in Premium Single Studio Apartments with ensuite kitchens, bathrooms and private balconies in the hyper-modern UNIC Student Residences. Students have access to building amenities which may include a gym, game room, study room, TV room, laundry facilities, cafes and restaurants. UNIC Residences are located in the upscale neighbourhood of Makedonitissa, in Nicosia, and are surrounded by UNIC's vibrant, urban campus that, in addition to 20 university buildings, is home to more than 40 restaurants, coffee shops, pubs and bars, all within walking distance.
