



Graduate Assistantship Positions 2025-2026

MASTER OF ARTS IN FOOD STUDIES

Graduate Assistant: Agroecology

The responsibilities of this position include 1) engaging with campus farm team and food production spaces 2) participating in action research with community-based stakeholders, and/or 3) managing agroecological trials for culturally relevant foods on the Eden Hall campus.

Graduate Assistant: Culinary Projects

This position will work with both Food Studies and the Center for Regional Agriculture, Food & Transformation (CRAFT) to support food production workshops and informal education; curriculum development for informal education related to culinary, tasting, farm-to-product, food business development, and food safety; provide support for professional development activities related to food production; and work with event management and promotion.

Graduate Assistant: Community Projects Assistant

This position will support a variety of initiatives, proposed research and development of presentations focusing on human health and wellness as it applies to food access issues and the alternative food system. Responsibilities include participation in grant-writing, PowerPoint creation, and outlining and writing presentations and papers for publication. Additionally, the position may aid in the organization and delivery of community-based health and wellness programs as needed and as time allows.

Graduate Assistant: Experiential Learning

This assistantship provides support for developing and engaging in experiential learning in the agricultural components of the Falk School and Food Studies program. The assistant will be a member of the farm team and engage in hands-on production and educational activities, support workshops and other kinds of training for experiential agricultural in the informal and formal educational spheres.

Forester Professional Graduate Assistant

This assistant will perform a variety of outdoor assignments, which allow the public to safely access and enjoy the Eden Hall woodlands. Duties include, but are not limited to, clearing downed trees from hiking trails and helping to remove invasive plant species; helping to promote the woodlands as an organizing focus for community development; planning and implementing community service projects and citizen engagement activities focused on trail improvement/enhancement; and developing citizen science programming to involve the community in collecting, analyzing, and making conclusions about woodlands data.

Graduate Assistant: Community Council Events

This position will provide administrative and logistical support to the Eden Hall Community Council and related student and community events at Eden Hall.

Graduate Assistant: Sustainable Business

This position will (1) support the Falk School's sustainable business program, (2) conduct research and support partnership development related to sustainable business, and (3) help coordinate the program's Sustainable Business academic pathway.

Graduate Assistant: Sustainability Program Coordination

This position will support the graduate sustainability program director in managing the academic program, including data management and tracking of program outcomes, as well as supporting program events.
