Important to-dos for new international students

This timeline is designed to give you direction on what still needs to be done to prepare for your start at Chatham this fall. Please carefully review this packet. Completing all necessary forms and familiarizing yourself with this information is a sure step toward your success at Chatham University.

Welcome to Chatham, and we look forward to seeing you in August!

WHEN ACCEPTED

- Pay your tuition deposit of \$150 US** at chatham.edu/deposit.
- Sign up to attend a **New Student Registration Day** at chatham.edu/undergrad-events. Earlier registration provides premium housing choices and best selection of courses! At a New Student Registration Day, you will register for classes, learn how to set up your student ID, set up your Chatham e-mail account, and meet members of the Chatham community.
- Pay your SEVIS I-901-fee online and plan your visa interview appointment** at the nearest US Consulate or Embassy as soon as you receive your admissions packet and I-20.
- If you are an eligible non-citizen or a permanent resident card holder, **complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** at www.fafsa.ed.gov and list Chatham's school code: 003244, by May 1.
- Reserve your place in on-campus housing** at my.chatham.edu > My Tools > Student Housing. A \$150 housing reservation fee (paid at this same site) is required to reserve your place and fill out the housing application.
- Application for Commuter Student Status:** Chatham University has a two-year residency requirement that has been waived for this coming year to help students to make the housing decision that best supports their individual needs due to COVID-19. Students who wish to commute and not live on-campus must complete the Application for Commuter Student Status. Once approved, you will be able to apply for a parking pass. Applications can be found at my.chatham.edu > Services and Departments > Student Engagement.

APRIL

- If you are an eligible non-citizen or permanent resident card holder, complete federal loan documents, Promissory Note and Entrance Counseling at www.studentaid.gov by July 1.

MAY

■ Housing Application & Reservation Fee Priority

Consideration Deadline: Housing applications are accepted on a rolling basis, however housing is only guaranteed for students who apply by June 1. Students who apply by the May 1 priority consideration deadline will be notified of their housing assignment by mid-June.

Students applying between May 2-June 1 will receive housing information by mid-July. Students who apply after June 1 are not guaranteed housing and will be placed based on availability. Students will be notified directly about their status.

- Ensure that your appointments are scheduled to meet with your physician to complete your medical forms via Med+Proctor at medproctor.com.

▼ Health/Immunization Record Information

You are required to submit health information and immunization record information **by August 1, 2021**, through a secure web-based software platform called Med+Proctor, which will become part of your health record in the Office of Student Health Services.

You will be receiving an e-mail to your **Chatham University e-mail** account from Med+Proctor shortly after you deposit prompting you to set-up your account, where you will complete and upload the required health and immunization record information, which will need to be verified by your doctor's office. Please be sure to check your Chatham e-mail account regularly (including the clutter and junk folders) for this e-mail. If you DON'T receive an invitation from MedProctor, go to medproctor.com/student-help and click the Login/Register link.

MAY 1

■ National tuition deposit deadline

- **Housing & Dining Medical Accommodation Request**
Deadline: Students who would like to submit a medical accommodation request related to student housing or their meal plan are encouraged to do so by May 1. For instructions and application information, visit my.chatham.edu > Services & Departments > Residence Life

MAY 14

- **Living Learning Community (LLC) Application Deadline:** If you are interested in being considered for one of our Living Learning Communities, complete the LLC section of your housing application by today. Learn more about LLCs at my.chatham.edu > MyTools > Student Housing.
- **Roommate Request Deadline:** If you would like to request a specific roommate, all roommate requests are due today. Roommate request must be mutual, meaning a request must be sent and accepted through the online housing application. Chatham attempts to honor all roommate requests, but roommate requests are not guaranteed and dependent upon space availability. Visit my.chatham.edu > MyTools > Student Housing.

▶ JUNE

- Notify your admission counselor and the Office of Financial Aid of any additional outside scholarships you receive. You'll want to make sure that you have funds sent to the Office of Financial Aid to credit your account before tuition bills are sent out.
- Tuition statements mailed by mid-June to all registered students.

MID-JUNE

- Housing announcements will be released for students who submitted their housing application before May 1.

▶ JULY

- Families can begin their payment planning with the Office of Student Accounts. 10-month and 8-month plans are offered.
- The Office of Admission needs to receive the following information to complete your file:
 - Final official transcripts from your high school and all colleges attended.
 - Advanced Placement (AP) test scores, if applicable
 - Dual enrollment/Post-Secondary Education Option (PSEO) college transcripts, if applicable.
 - International Baccalaureate Diploma/Certificate, if applicable.
- Confirm with Chatham Office of International Affairs that you are attending.

- Apply for your student visa as soon as you receive your 1-20. Do not purchase your flight until you have received your Visa.
- Airport pick-up is arranged on specific dates. Please check your e-mail for more information. The deadline to request airport pickup for students living on campus is August 1.
- **Submit information for your student ID card at chatham.edu/orientation.** You will receive your ID when you come to campus for orientation. For more information, contact OSA@chatham.edu.
- **Meal Plans:** be sure to register for your meal plan. On-campus residents will select a plan when they complete the online housing application. Commuter students will be sent an e-mail in August with the option to sign up for a meal plan.

If you will be living on upper campus, you must take one of the "Chatham" meal plans. If you are living in one of the Chatham-owned apartments, you must take one of the "Rachel" meal plans at a minimum. Commuter students may also purchase meal plans. **For more details on the meal plan options, visit chatham.edu/student-experience.**

- Begin to research book purchasing options for fall classes. If you know your course schedule, you can find required textbooks at bkstr.com/chathamstore.
- Deposited students who are registered for fall 2021 classes can **begin enrolling in Student Health Insurance coverage** after July 1, 2021 on my.chatham.edu. All international students are required to have health insurance whether it is from Chatham University or another entity.

BY MID-JULY

- Housing announcements will be released for students who submitted their housing application between May 2-June 1.

JULY 15

- **10-month payment plans: First tuition payment is due today.** Five monthly installments beginning on July 15 for the fall term and December 15 for the spring term.

▶ AUGUST

- ❑ Register for New Student Orientation at chatham.edu/orientation. Contact the Office of Student Affairs at osa@chatham.edu with questions.

AUGUST 1

- ❑ **Health/immunization records due today** via Med+Proctor. You received an invitation to complete this paperwork through your Chatham e-mail shortly after you deposited.
- ❑ **Airport arrival form is due** by today to the Office of International Affairs.

AUGUST 13

- ❑ **8-month payment plans: First tuition payment is due today.** Four monthly installments beginning on August 15 for the fall term and December 15 for the spring term.
- ❑ **Alcohol.edu and Sexual Assault Prevention modules must be completed by today.** Instructions were sent to your Chatham e-mail in late July.

AlcoholEdu and Sexual Assault Prevention AlcoholEdu and Sexual Assault Prevention are mandatory online programs that must be completed prior to Orientation.

AlcoholEdu is a nationally recognized program and 36% of all first year students at America's four year institutions participate. AlcoholEdu is designed for all students – whether you are a frequent drinker or a non-drinker. This educational tool will help prepare you for college life and will provide the University with important data on alcohol behaviors which can help Chatham gain grants and offer better program opportunities for students.

With data from the National Institute of Justice showing that one in five college women (and one in 16 men) will experience some form of non-consensual sexual activity by graduation, the widespread impact of sexual violence on students presents an urgent and pressing challenge for our nation's campuses. Sexual Assault Prevention addresses the critical issues of sexual assault, relationship violence, and stalking, which impact countless college students across the country.

- ❑ Consider applying for **campus employment opportunities** on Handshake at chatham.joinhandshake.com/login. Use your Chatham Username and Password to set up your account, click on **Jobs**, and apply the **On Campus** filter.

Incoming first-year and transfer students move into their residence hall or apartment and begin New and Transfer Student Orientation. A move-in time will be sent assigned to you prior to your arrival. Fall student athletes may move in prior to this date and will be notified accordingly.

STUDENT LAPTOPS

Through the Chatham One-to-One Program, the University provides all incoming full-time undergraduate first-year students and full-time transfer students a laptop computer, the Microsoft Office Professional suite of applications online through Microsoft Office 365, 4-year manufacturer's warranty, 4-year Accidental Damage Protection and theft insurance, and a Chatham University logoed backpack. Ownership of the computer, accessories, and backpack are transferred to the student upon graduation.
