CENTER FOR WOMEN'S ENTREPRENEURSHIP EXPANDS 2019 INCUBATEHER PROGRAM FOR WOMEN BUSINESSES

PITTSBURGH: Chatham University's <u>Center for Women Entrepreneurship</u> (<u>Center</u>) has opened applications for the 2019 cohort of IncubateHER: a competitive year-long business incubation program for early-stage women entrepreneurs with product or service-based businesses in the greater Pittsburgh region.

IncubateHER is a free program that provides participants with industryspecific mentors, entrepreneurial education and training through Chatham's Women's Business Center (CWBC), a tailored growth curriculum, peer-to-peer mentoring through cohort meetups, and a yearlong membership to the Center for immersive networking opportunities. Through this membership, IncubateHER participants will also get free access to the Center's Prototyping & Design Lab to use digital fabrication tools to ideate and create new products or expand their product lines. In addition, **participants will receive a \$1,500 grant** at the successful completion of the program to help grow their businesses.

In 2019, the program is being expanded to ten participants from five in 2018. Applications are due by November 30 2018 at 5pm EST with interviews to be held in December. The program will start January 2019. Visit <u>www.chatham.edu/cwe/incubateHer/</u> for more information and to apply.
